

2019 SCHEDULE OF FEES AND SURCHARGES



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1.1 MEMBERSHIPS

A BRAC membership, for individual or clubs, provides benefits not available to non-members (see BRAC General Policy Manual). Memberships end on December 31st.

1.1.1 Individual

Senior/Master Membership* (>18)	\$ 30 per year
Official's Membership	\$ 30 per year
Junior Membership (18 and under)	\$ 15 per year
One-Day Membership	\$ 5 per day
(\$3 to BRAC, \$2 to event director)	

1.1.2 For racers participating in a BRAC competitive event with a USAC One-Day Beginner license, and for out-of-state riders, the BRAC one-day membership fee is waived.

1.1.3 Club Membership \$ 95 per year

* Please note: Senior/Master and Junior Memberships are only available to current USAC members.

1.2 BRAC OPERATIONAL SURCHARGES

Definition: An Operational Surcharge is a fee paid by all racers to support BRAC's operational budget.

1.2.1 The operational surcharge to be collected is \$ 1.50 per rider per day at all USAC competitive events in the area for which the Bicycle Racing Association of Colorado serves as the Local Association of USAC.

1.2.2 Operational surcharges are waived for collegiate riders competing in collegiate classes at events run under collegiate permits.

1.2.3 Operational surcharges are due 21 days after BRAC sends the club the surcharge report. Surcharges not paid within 21 days will incur a \$100 late fee per week overdue.

1.3 USAC INSURANCE SURCHARGE

Definition: This insurance surcharge is set by USAC, and collected by all USAC clubs/Race Directors to pay for the insurance for racers on race day. The USAC surcharges are subject to change by USAC at any time. At the beginning of 2019, they were as follows

1.3.1 Competitive Events (Road,Track,Cyclocross) - \$ 4.00/rider/day

1.3.2 Non-Competitive Events

- Fun Rides, Tours, Charity Rides - \$3.25/rider/day
- Training Rides, Clinics, and Camps - \$3.50/rider/day
- Gran Fondos & Gravel - \$4.00 /rider/day



1.4 RACE CALENDAR DEPOSITS

Definition: A Race Calendar Deposit is a refundable fee collected from a promoting club so that their event is listed on the BRAC calendar.

Please Note: Only BRAC member clubs will have their calendar listing function as a link to their event flyer.

The deposit is \$100, due when the event is submitted for inclusion on the race calendar. The fee will be subtracted from the surcharges after the successful completion of the event. A race cancelled by force majeure will also be refunded the deposit.

1.5 REGISTRATION AND RACE SUPPLIES

Supplies typically needed for registration purposes. Supplies are provided per one USAC event permit:

- 1.5.1 BRAC maintains a supply of race numbers. Clubs that do not wish to acquire numbers themselves from other sources may get them at no cost from BRAC, subject to limitations. Numbers from BRAC may have BRAC sponsors on the title.
- 1.5.2 Race Directors who purchase their own rider numbers must make sure that their numbers meet BRAC minimum standards as described in the General Policy.
- 1.5.3 BRAC clubs have full use of the BRAC race kit free of charge. However, any loss or damage to BRAC equipment will be charged back to the club.

1.6 OFFICIALS FEES

Officials Fees are based on the highest race category (which is based on prize list) plus the cost of reasonable and necessary travel.

- 1.6.1 Minimum Fees

- 1.6.2 The work day shall begin when the official arrives at the site or one hour before the first race, whichever is later, and will end at the time when the required work is completed.
- 1.6.3 Mileage to and from the official's home and during the race will determine what is to be charged. Race Director's shall also pay the maximum IRS business mileage rate to, during, and from the event and/or venue inspection. The current rate can be found at www.irs.gov.
- 1.6.4 The Race Director is responsible to provide housing and meals if an overnight stay is necessary before, during, or after the race.
- 1.6.5 The Race Director must provide a meal and liquid refreshments for officials who work more than five hours during an event day. If meal(s) are not provided, the Race Director shall pay an additional \$15.00. If officials have dietary restrictions that the Race Director cannot meet and/or chooses to bring their own food, then they will be paid \$10.00. For multiple day races, when an overnight stay is required, the race director shall pay each official a \$35 per diem.
- 1.6.6 A Chief Referee may charge a \$ 50.00 plus mileage for a site visit if the Chief Referee feels that such a visit is necessary. If an overnight stay is required, housing and a per diem of \$25 are required.
- 1.6.7 In case a race is canceled after officials have begun their travel, officials will receive a half-day fee and their mileage.
