- Objective:** To understand the role of and be able to function as a motor official at a local or regional bicycle race. The course focuses on the skills required to work as a motor official at local events. Discussion during the class will include the equipment necessary to perform as a motor official as well as the specific roles of a motor official at time trials, road races, and criteriums.

The class is taught in a live classroom environment, and no motorcycle is required for the course. In order to get the most from the class, please review the road racing section of the current USA Cycling Rule Book prior to the beginning of the class. Another resource to help you prepare for our discussion is the USAC Motorcycle Handbook, which can be found [here](#).

Requirements: Need to complete the following either prior to attending the class, or within 30 days after attending the clinic. All of the below requirements are part of the normal process of becoming a race official.

Category C Online Officials Course – Online course which covers the basics of how to become an official, what role officials play in the sport, what duties officials perform, and what rules are important for a new official to understand. New official's license will cost \$25. (Note that BRAC will reimburse BRAC-member officials the cost of this first license after they work 3 BRAC races.

SafeSport - The US Olympic Committee (USOC) mandates that officials take a Safe Sport seminar, which also includes a short exam. The course offers training regarding misconduct in sport and the measures one can take to protect athletes. This qualification is valid for 2 years and is free. Concussion Awareness - BRAC requires all officials assigned to events in our LA to complete the "Heads UP Concussion" online training course. The course will help you understand a concussion and the potential consequences of this injury; recognize concussion signs and symptoms and how to respond; and focuses on prevention and preparedness to help keep athletes safe. Once completed you would need to send the copy of the certificate to the BRAC office. The course is free and can be found [here](#).

Criminal Background Check - All officials are required to submit to a USOC mandated background check, which is valid for 2 years. Cost is around \$25 but if you are a BRAC member, that fee will be reimbursed. The link to the background check can be found [here](#).

Motor Vehicle Record Check - Process conducted via [FirstAdvantage](#) which checks your driving record. Cost \$8.80. BRAC reimburses this to BRAC-member officials.
