**Where:** Lookout Mtn. Youth Services Center. 2901 Ford Street, Golden, Colorado. Just South of the roundabout at Johnson Rd. and South Golden Rd. **To get to the race course:** As you enter the main drive for the facility, you'll see a dirt road on the left immediately before the entrance gate. Follow the dirt road required to race parking. There is **NO PARKING** on the asphalt. Please honor this so we can keep using this facility. All riders must present an annual or 1-day USAC license. USAC annuals available at [usacycling.org](http://usacycling.org). USAC 1-Day, \$10, need to be purchased online at BikeReg when registering. Neither will be sold at race site. All Colorado annual licensees need to have a Colorado Cycling membership. Annual Colorado Cycling membership needed to receive CX Cup points. Colorado Cycling annuals available at [coloradocycling.org](http://coloradocycling.org) Colorado Cycling 1-day (\$5) available at race site [and on BikeReg when registering](http://www.bikereg.com).

**Pre-Registration** will close at 11:59 pm on Thursday Oct. 21. With regard to everyone's safety during the pandemic there will be NO DAY OF registration. All registration is online pre-registration. **Sr. entry fee:** \$36.00 per single day, \$60.00 if you pre-register for both days. **Jr. entry fee:** \$16.00 per single day, \$25.00 if you pre-register for both days.

**Course Preview:** Use the bypass lane by the finish line!!! Riders are only allowed on the course when the GREEN FLAG is up.

- **This is a series event with an overall prize list for both days of racing**
- **You may choose to race one day only, but then you are not in contention for the overall prize list**
- **Point distribution will be 15 places deep: 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1**
  - **Schedule: the same schedule for both days of racing.**
- **A portion of each entry fee will be donated to the Amy D Foundation**
- **The Courses: We guarantee a new and different course each day of racing. Field limits: 125 riders per wave**

In her short but full life, Amy touched the hearts of communities in the United States and Europe. Amy had a passion for life that transcended the sport of cycling; she loved to share this passion with the friends and family that surrounded her. She also had an uncanny ability to transform challenges she faced in her own life into intense positive focus. The tattoo of a lightning bolt that Amy bore on her wrist served as a remembrance of her mother's tragic death, and provided her a daily source of motivation.
